ORDER

As per the letter read above, the Director of Health Services has requested to issue Guidelines for internship in institutions under the Health Department for students of various paramedical courses from Government-Controlled/Private self-financing approved institutions within and outside the State.

The Government have examined the matter in detail are pleased to issue the following guidelines for internship in institutions under the Health Department for students of various paramedical courses from Government-Controlled/Private self-financing approved institutions within and outside the State:

- (a) The institute shall remit ₹5,000/- per month per student as indicated in the Government order referred above, for availing in the benefit of using the Government Hospital for training purposes.
- (b) The amount so collected shall be deposited to the account of HDC of the hospitals concerned.
- (c) The management of the institution will execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the respective Hospital Superintendent in Stamp paper

worth

₹ 200/-.

(d) The students at the time of their training in the hospital will be under the control of the District Medical Officer (H) concerned and the student shall execute a bond to the effect that they will not, in any way, violate the rules and regulations of the hospital where they undergo the training. If they violate the bond conclusion they will be refused the training facility at these hospitals forthwith.

(e) The Director of Health Service should be consulted before effecting any improvement/additions.

(f) The College will arrange for necessary laboratory equipment and also for the upkeep of the existing system

(g) Training for the student should be fixed in consultation with the Superintendent of the hospital without affecting the routine work of the hospital. Classes should not create any inconvenience to Patients and Staff.

(h) Students may be permitted to observe and examine the patients in OP and IP.

(i) Any loss or damages that happened from the part of the training, the concerned Hospital Superintendent will be competent to recover the liabilities from the bidder of the Memorandum of Understanding signed.

(j) The personal Bio-data of the deputing trainees is to be registered in the respective hospital before they are deputed for training.
